<b>Varicella ‡</b> (chickenpox) <a href="#">Vaccine HealthFile</a>	 1 or 2 doses ‡ 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose at least 3 months after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
<b>Tdap</b> (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) <a href="#">Vaccine HealthFile</a>		 1 dose

‡ Children who had chickenpox or shingles disease at 1 year of age or older do not need the chickenpox vaccine. Children who received a single dose of chickenpox vaccine at a younger age only need 1 dose in grade 6. Children who have never received the chickenpox vaccine need 2 doses.
